

Behaviour Principles for Brickhouse Primary School

The school will:

- Have high expectations of behaviour from all pupils.
- Have a whole school approach to pupil discipline to ensure consistency.
- Ensure its leadership team deals consistently with incidences of unacceptable behaviour.
- Ensure that classroom management provides an environment conducive to 'on task' behaviour and minimise uncertainty and disruption in lessons.
- Regularly train and support all staff in behaviour management.
- · Reward good behaviour.
- Set good examples to pupils in the way adults treat them and other adults.
- Provide support to pupils in improving behaviours.
- Involve parents in the process by communicating policy and expectations clearly, and by informing them swiftly and discussing any behavioural concerns of their children.
- Create a positive partnership with parents to encourage their support when dealing with the difficult issue of unacceptable behaviour.

- Support behaviour management through circle time in PHSME,
 Class Time, and individual counselling.
- Identify and address any underlying causes of poor behaviour with criticism focussing on the behaviour not the child.
- Ensure that pupils are given opportunities to put things right.
- Discipline pupils whose behaviour is unacceptable, who break the school rules or fail to follow a reasonable instruction.

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
